Class Level Breakdown & Attire for Classes

Level Placement

All new students will be placed in class levels based on a private evaluation with one of our teachers or by observation in class.

→ Email us to schedule a private evaluation!

→ Students ages 2 through second grade do not need an evaluation.

Age & Level Breakdown:

- **Tiny Tots**: Ages 2–3 years old as of Jan 1 that year.
- **K4/K5 Classes**: Dancers in K4 or K5 during that school year.
- First Grade Classes: Dancers in first grade during that school year.
- Second Grade Classes: Dancers in second grade during that school year.
- Level 3 (Ages 9+): Newer dancers with little to few years of training.
- Level 4 (Ages 9+): Must have completed Level 3 for one year or have teacher approval.
- Level 5 (Ages 9+): Must have trained at our studio for at least 3 years or have teacher approval.
- Level 6 (Ages 9+): Must have trained at our studio for at least 4 years or have teacher approval.
- **Pointe**: Must be a minimum of a Level 5 dancer.

Class Descriptions & Attire

Note: All classes are a financial commitment through May. Injured dancers may schedule makeups, we will work with you on a makeup plan.

Our class structure and attire guidelines are modeled after renowned professional studios such as Broadway Dance Center and Steps in NYC, as well as Millennium and Playground in LA. This approach allows us to maintain a focused, professional environment that prepares our dancers for success in both recreational and pre-professional settings

Tiny Tots (Ages 2–3) & MBPC class

- Ballet, Jazz, Hip Hop, Musical Theatre, and Creative Movement.
- Performs 1 ballet dance at Showcase in May.
- Attire: Tight-fitting dance-wear, hair pulled back, cloth pink ballet shoes
- Will wear cloth pink ballet shoes for Showcase.
- We prefer leotard and tights for this class, but tights are optional and up to parent discretion.
 - (We understand tights can be uncomfortable or tricky for potty breaks at this age.)
- Costume fee and Showcase fee billed.
- Why Barefoot for some genres? We dance barefoot to help dancers feel grounded and develop proper muscle engagement and balance from the floor up. Bare feet also allow for greater control, connection, and articulation during movement.

K4/K5 Classes

- Ballet, Jazz, Hip Hop, and Musical Theatre.
- Performs 1 Jazz dance at Showcase (barefoot).
- **Attire**: Tight-fitting dance-wear, hair pulled back, pink cloth ballet shoes for Ballet, Jazz/ Musical theatre are done barefoot, hip hop bring tennis shoes.
- We prefer leotard and tights for this class, but dance attire is up to parent discretion.
- Costume fee and Showcase fee billed.
- Why Barefoot for some genres? We dance barefoot to help dancers feel grounded and develop proper muscle engagement and balance from the floor up. Bare feet also allow for greater control, connection, and articulation during movement.

First Grade Ballet/Jazz

- Ballet and Jazz technique.
- Performs 1 Jazz dance at Showcase (barefoot).
- Most students pair with First Grade Hip Hop/Musical Theatre.
- **Attire**: Tight-fitting dance-wear, hair pulled back, pink cloth ballet shoes for Ballet, Jazz portion is done barefoot.
- We prefer leotard and tights for this class, but dance attire is up to parent discretion.
- Costume fee and Showcase fee billed.

First Grade Hip Hop/Musical Theatre

- Rhythm and performance-based class.
- Performs 1 dance Musical Theatre Dance at Showcase (barefoot).
- Attire: Tight-fitting dancewear, hair pulled back, any brand of tennis shoes for Hip Hop, Musical Theatre will be done barefoot.
- Costume fee and Showcase fee billed.
- Why Barefoot for some genres? We dance barefoot to help dancers feel grounded and develop proper muscle engagement and balance from the floor up. Bare feet also allow for greater control, connection, and articulation during movement.

Second Grade Ballet/Jazz/Hip Hop/Musical Theatre

- Ballet, Jazz, Hip Hop, and Musical Theatre
- Performs 1 Jazz dance at Showcase (barefoot).
- **Attire**: Tight-fitting dancewear, hair pulled back, pink cloth ballet shoes for ballet portion, tennis shoes (any brand) for hip hop portion, barefoot for jazz/musical theatre.
- We prefer leotard and tights for this class, but dance attire is up to parent discretion.

- Performs 1 Jazz dance (barefoot) at Showcase in May.

- Why Barefoot for some genres? We dance barefoot to help dancers feel grounded and develop proper muscle engagement and balance from the floor up. Bare feet also allow for greater control, connection, and articulation during movement.

Ballet

Technique only. No performance.

- Barre, center work, and across-the-floor exercises.
- Attire: Tight-fitting dance-wear, pink cloth ballet shoes, hair pulled back.

• Jazz

Weekly combinations to build choreography retention.

- O Technique only. No performance.
- Attire: Tight-fitting dance-wear, hair pulled back, barefoot.

Turns/Leaps

Focused on jazz turns and leaps.

- O Technique only. No performance.
- O **Attire**: Tight-fitting dance-wear, hair pulled back, barefoot.

Hip Hop

Breakdancing basics and weekly combos.

- O Technique only. No performance.
- O Attire: Tight-fitting dance-wear, hair pulled back, tennis shoes.

• Combo Class (Level 5–6)

Genre rotation: Hip Hop, Jazz, Lyrical, Musical Theatre & more.

- o Technique only. No performance.
- Attire: Tight-fitting dance-wear, hair pulled back.
 Bring tennis shoes for Hip Hop. All other genres danced barefoot.
- Why Barefoot for some genres? We dance barefoot to help dancers feel grounded and develop proper muscle engagement and balance from the floor up. Bare feet also allow for greater control, connection, and articulation during movement.

Pointe

Level 5+ dancers only. Starts on flat until approved for pointe shoes.

- O Teacher will guide purchase and sewing process.
- O Attire: Tight-fitting dance-wear, hair pulled back, pointe shoes.

Allstars

Adaptive class for dancers with special needs.

- O Performs 1 Jazz dance at Showcase (barefoot).
- O Attire: Dancewear, hair back, barefoot.
- Costume fee and Showcase fee billed.
